Focusing on three seminal (post-)colonial texts by Joseph Conrad, E.M. Forster and Hanif Kureishi, this seminar offers not only text analyses based on close reading as well as on different theoretical approaches, it also intends to give a critical survey of recent developments in post-colonial theory. Critics discussed in this context will include Frantz Fanon, Homi K. Bhabha, Edward Said, Gayatri Spivak and others, while the concepts we shall focus on range from "alterity," "hybridity" and "third space" to "difference vs. diversity."
