GPA 3.0/4.0 graduate students. <u>Undergraduate students must have at least 30 completed credits</u> (US equivalent semester) on the transcript to be evaluated. <u>Graduate students must have at least 18</u> (US equivalent semester) completed credits on the transcript to be evaluated.
Availability of Application	Our office will send you the International Student Exchange Application link to provide to your nominated students.
Acceptance Package	Review of applications begins immediately following the receipt of application and required supporting documentation. A decision regarding confirmation of acceptance will be determined within a month of submission completion. An admissions packet will be issued and sent to the sponsoring institution, unless otherwise requested.

Language of Instruction	All courses offered to exchange students are conducted in English.
Arrival Pick-Up Service	We provide airport pick-up service for international exchange students. Student completes Request for <u>Airport Pickup</u> at least two weeks prior to requested pick up date.
Minimum and Maximum Number of Units/Credits for Full-Time Exchange Student	Undergraduate students must enroll in a minimum of 12 units/credits and 16 maximum credits. Graduate students must enroll in a minimum of 9 units/credits and up to 16 maximum credits.
Transcripts <u>after completion</u>	Transcripts from Nevada can be issued and sent to the home institution starting the first week after the end of the semester. Students must submit a request for transcripts to be sent by going to the link found at: <u>https://www.unr.edu/academic- central/forms-and-policies/forms/transcripts.</u> International students need to use the former Students link and use their NSHE ID in the Student ID field, leaving the SSN field blank.
Course Availability/Registration for Exchange Students	Generally, students can take any course listed in the <u>catalog</u> provided they meet all prerequisites and of appropriate level. International exchange students should refer to <u>MyNEVADA</u> to check course availability and schedules. If waiving prerequisites, students will be directed to an academic advisor based on their major. Requirements may vary by department and the process to waive prerequisites can take time therefore students should plan ahead as much as possible. <i>Special Note for the College of Business – there is a very high demand for courses in the</i> <i>College of Business.</i> While exchange students are not restricted from taking business courses, they should be aware that it may be more difficult to enroll in certain courses and they may need to be flexible with their course selection.
Visa	After being accepted to the University of Nevada, Reno Exchange program, your acceptance packet will include your DS2019. Once the hard copy of these items is received, students will need to meet with a US embassy/consulate in their home country to obtain a student travel visa. On-campus Housing Application Process	 Students need their NSHE ID The License Agreement encompasses the entire academic year or remainder thereof. Apply by March 1 for the best chance of being assigned to the space of your choice. Assignments are made for new students in the order in which their applications and initial payment are received. The Living Learning Community requires an additional application. You will need the following before applying: Demographic information such as name, address, phone, email, etc. What semesters you plan on living with us Housing details such as residence hall preference, roommate information, rooming preferences (organized, sleep patterns, etc.) Meal plan option Emergency contact information A credit card for your \$325 Payment For more information, please visit: www.unr.edu/housing Apply at: www.unr.edu/housing/resources/reslife-apply. *Cost is estimated to be about \$5,350 per semester, depending on the meal plan chosen.

Health Insurance Requirements	 Exchange students must have health insurance coverage, or purchase the University insurance. Health insurance documentation must include: Name & dates of coverage Medical benefits of at least \$100,000 per accident or illness; with no lifetime maximum. Repatriation of remains in the amount of \$25,000 Expenses associated with the medical evacuation of the student to his or her home country in the amount of \$50,000 A deductible not to exceed \$500 per accident or illness. Waivers/Appeals are not processed until after billing. Estimated costs of insurance is \$1100/semester.
Vaccination Requirements	 Students are required to provide the official immunization documentation. You must submit the completed Immunization and Physical Evaluation Clearance Form to OISS at oiss@unr.edu prior to your arrival at the University. Immunization 2 doses of measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) An immunization within the last 10 years for Tetanus/Diphtheria (Td/Tdap) A quadrivalent meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MVC4) on or after 16th birthday Acceptable Versions are: Menactra, Menveo, or MCV4 For more information, please see the student FAQ page Tuberculosis (TB) Blood Test result/ QuantiFERON COVID-19 Vaccination. Complete dosage(s) required. Please note, if you do not have the immunizations completed prior to your arrival at the University, you will not be eligible for class registration. You are also required to make your own arrangements for the immunizations.
Language Requirements for Exchange Students	 Verification of having met the English requirement through one of the following: Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) score of 61 undergraduate/79 graduate (iBT-Internet-Based Test) International English Language Testing System (IELTS) score of 6 undergraduate/6.5 graduate. Duolingo score 95 undergraduate/105 graduate. Pearson Test of English (PTE) Academic score of 57. Indicate 'Institution Code 4844' and 'Undergraduate 00' to Educational Testing Service (ETS) to ensure that the scores are sent directly to UNR. Copies of scores sent directly from the sending institution are acceptable. EXEMPTION: Please note that students coming from select English-speaking countries are exempt from the English language testing requirements for admission. List located here.
