

Information obligation according to Art. 13 GDPR on photo and video recordings

For what purpose will personal data be processed?

We would like to inform you that individual and group photos as well as video recordings will be made at the events of the International Office/ Cultural Office. The photo and video recordings will be used for the purpose of documenting and as part of our public relations work.

Who is responsible for data processing and to whom can data subjects turn?

What is the legal basis for the processing of personal data?

The legal basis for the above-mentioned data is of personal data is Art. 6 para. 1 letter a) GDPR.

What personal data will be processed?

Both individual and group photographs, video recordings and the names of the authors will be processed.

How will personal data be processed and how long will it be stored?

The data will be stored and processed until revocation.

Will personal data be transferred to third parties?

As part of our public relations work, we will forward the recordings and author information to the local press and reputable cultural partners.

Please note: When published on the internet, personal data (including photos) may be accessed and stored worldwide. The data may also be found via so-called "search engines". It cannot be ruled out that other persons or companies may link the data with other personal data available on the internet and thus create a personality profile, modify the data or use it for other purposes.

What general rights do data subjects have?

Voluntariness and withdrawal (Art. 7 para. 3 GDPR)

The submission of personal data is voluntary. You can refuse or withdraw your consent at any time without stating a reason to the person responsible for the data. Your personal data will then not be processed any further. The withdrawal shall not affect the lawfulness of the processing that took place on the basis of the consent given up until the withdrawal.

Right of access to personal data (Art. 15 GDPR)

You have the right to obtain information on the data processed concerning your person, as well as the possible recipients of this data, at any time. You are entitled to a reply within one month after the responsible party receives the request for information.

Right to rectification, erasure and restriction (Art. 16–18 GDPR)

You may request that TU Dresden correct or erase your personal data and/or restrict its processing at any time.

Right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR)

You may request that the responsible party send you your personal data in a machine-readable form. Alternatively, you can request the direct transfer of your personal data to a different responsible party, insofar as this is possible.

Right to lodge a complaint (Art. 77 GDPR)

You can contact TU Dresden's Data Protection Officer (see above) at any time and, in the case of a complaint pursuant to Art. 77 GDPR, the responsible supervisory authority for data protection.
